WOW Bus (Fort St. John, Taylor, Hudson's Hope & Area)	Coordinator for WOW Bus. The WOW Bus is a real community partnership and will travel to outlying neighbourhoods and communities to deliver early childhood development resources and increase access to early learning opportunities for children, aged 0 to 6. (2007 - 2008)
