Nass Valley Salmon Berry Fairs	Nass Valley ECD Committee sponsored community Early Years Health and Fun Fairs in Gingolx, Laxgalts'ap, Gitwinksihlkw and New Aiyansh to provide information and health screening, raise public awareness about the importance of the early years and engage young families in developmentally appropriate fun. (2005 - 2007)

Aboriginal Programs	Program Description
Terrace/Kitimaat & Area Communities	Working with an Aboriginal Engagement Table with representatives from five First Nations Tribal groups in the area: Tahltan, Nisga'a, Gitksan, Tsimshian and Haisla. The Aboriginal ECD funds will be used to leverage additional funding to develop up to 5 Aboriginal Coordinator positions, develop a template for environmental scan to identify existing cultural resources and to provide cultural awareness activities and projects as identified by the Aboriginal communities/tribal groups.
